PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Pennsylvania:

The petition of Herman Alexander Brody,

First. My place of residence is 5545 Phillips Ave Pittsburgh, hereby filed, respectfully chronicle,

Second. My occupation is Furniture Salesman (name, street, and city or town), Pennsylvania.

Third. I was born on the 17th day of March, anno Domini 1900, Banovce, Czechoslovakia.

Fourth. I immigrated to the United States from Rotterdam, as of about the 23rd day of November,

anno Domini 1920, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 4th day of December,

anno Domini 1920 on the vessel Rotterdam.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States at the 25th of March, anno Domini 1922.

Sixth. I am married, my wife's name is Eleanor, (she) was born on the 20th day of August, anno Domini 1901,

and now resides at with me, Pennsylvania.

I have 2 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Herbert Irving, April 1, 1926, Pittsburgh, Pa., with me.

Sidney Jerome, April 1, 1926, " "

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 4th day of December, anno Domini 1922, and in the State of Pennsylvania, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 12th day of January, anno Domini 1923, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. I made petition for citizenship to the _____ court of _____ on the _____ day of _____, anno Domini 19____, and the said petition was denied by the said court for the following reasons and causes, to wit:

..... and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed. Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the affidavit from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two testifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore upon petition, pray that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
