Don Wickham To Speak At GOP Barbecue

Don J. Wickham, New York State Commissioner of agriculture and markets, will be the speaker at the Herkimer County Republican Family Barbecue to be held at West Winfield, Sunday, August 30th, it was announced today by Milburn J. Huntley and Anthony Cosentino, co-chairmen of the event.

Don J. Wickham was born at Hector, Schuyler County, November 1, 1903. His father, William, was a farmer and fruit grower.

Wickham attended Burdett Union School, Genesee Wesleyan Seminary at Lima and was graduated by the New York State College of Agriculture, Cornell University, in 1924 with a degree of Bachelor of Science. He married Florence W. Miner, November 29, 1924. They have three children, William, David and Mary Jane.

Immediately after graduation Mr. Wickham began farming in his home community, specializing in dairy, poultry and fruit production. During recent years he has specialized in fruit growing, operating more than 100 acres of cherries, peaches and grapes. In addition to his farm enterprises he owns, operates a general country store at Hector and is engaged in the bulk oil and gasoline business. His two sons are associated with him in the farming partnership.

Mr. Wickham has served as president of the highly successful Finger Lakes Fruit Products Cooperative of Watkins Glen and has played an important role in developing this cooperative which has given new life to the grape industry of his region. This cooperative is now merged with National Grape Growers Cooperative of Westfield.

Mr. Wickham was president of the Schuyler County Farm and Home Bureau and 4-H Association, Master of his local Grange and was head field man and later Deputy Executive Assistant of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration in New York. He resigned the latter assignment in 1943 to devote full time to his farm operations. That same year, however, he was named vice president of the New
