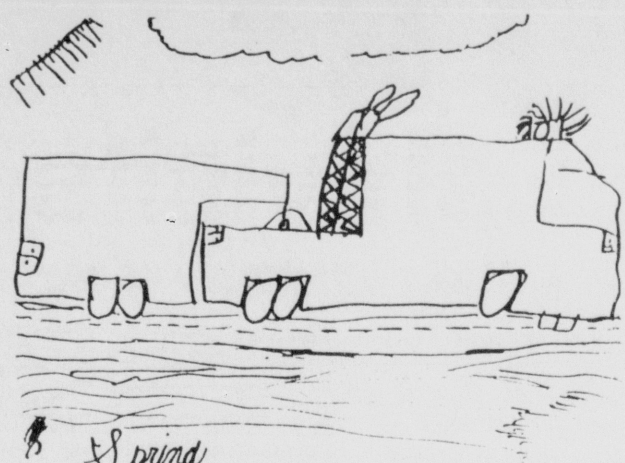

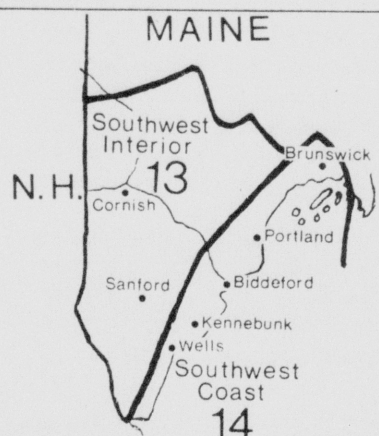
Weather watch**Maine**

Chance of showers or flurries Thursday. Fair Friday. Chance of showers Saturday. Low in the 20s. Highs in the lower 40s to lower 50s.



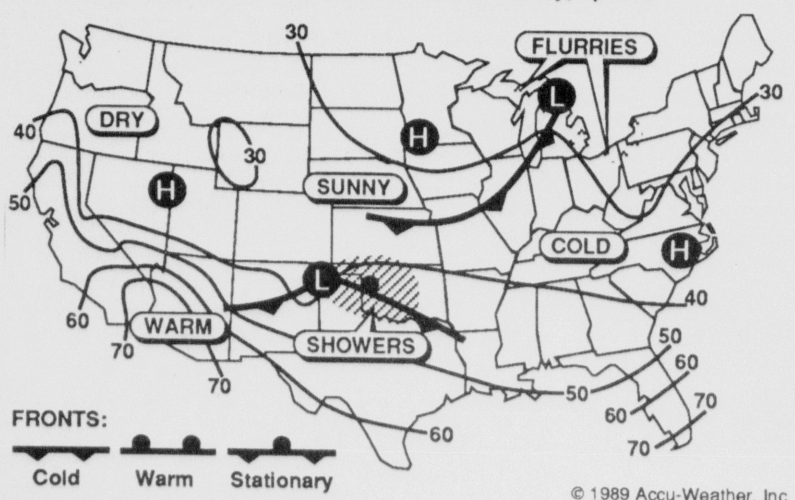
This weather satellite photograph taken at 2:30 p.m. Monday shows mostly clear skies over the Northeast.

Today's highlight in history: Three hundred years ago, on April 11, 1689, William III and Mary II were crowned as joint sovereigns in Britain, two months after their reign had begun as part of the "Glorious Revolution" that deposed James II.
On this date:
In 1814, Napoleon Bonaparte

abdicated as emperor of France and was banished to the island of Elba.
In 1898, President William McKinley asked Congress for a declaration of war against Spain.
In 1899, the treaty ending the Spanish-American War was declared in effect.
In 1921, Iowa became the first state to impose a cigarette tax.
In 1953, Oveta Culp Hobby became the first Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare.

Doris Woodman, town historian

LEBANON — Doris E. Woodman, 67, of Smith Road, former town librarian and town treasurer, died Sunday at H.D. Goodall Hospital in Sanford after a long illness.

She was born in Lebanon on Sept. 17, 1921, a daughter of Raymond J. and Eva Goodwin Ricker, and lived here all her life. She attended Sanford schools and graduated from Sanford High School.

She also graduated from Gorham State Teachers College and Keene (N.H.) State Teachers College.

She was the first principal of the special education program at the Hawthorne School, Sanford, and more recently was a self-employed accountant and tax preparer.

Mrs. Woodman and her husband operated a foster home in Maine from the late 1940s until the early 1960s. She was librarian for the town of Lebanon for 10 years, town treasurer for 14 years and had served on the Forest Grove Cemetery Committee. She was active in the York County Community Action Corp.

Mrs. Woodman was consulted regularly on the history of Lebanon and was regarded as the town's unofficial historian.

Surviving are her husband of 49 years, Wilbur E. Woodman Jr. of Lebanon; three sons, Eldon Woodman of Sanford, Hugh Woodman of North Lebanon and Stephen Woodman of West Lebanon; a foster son, Robert Thompson of North Lebanon; a brother, Merle Ricker of Sanford; 12 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

At Mrs. Woodman's request, there will be no funeral.

Burial will be in Forest Grove Cemetery, North Lebanon.

Arrangements are by the Heald Funeral Home, Springvale.

Corona Poitras, former store owner
