# **Weather watch**


#### Maine

Chance of showers or flurries Thursday, Fair Friday, Chance of showers Saturday. Low in the 20s. Highsin the lower 40s to lower 50s.




This weather satellite photograph taken at 2:30 p.m. Monday shows mostly clear skies over the Northeast.
