According to a nation-wide survey conducted for the JCNS by Pori Public Opinion Research of Israel Ltd - 55.8 per cent approved unconditionally and 19.2 per cent did so "because there was no other choice. Altogether 75 per cent were of opinion that the Government acted correctly in the matter.

However, according to the survey, 10.8 per cent of Israelis questioned said that the Government should not have conducted an exchange with the Syrians on the ground that it was a precedent to encourage more kidnapping. A total of 14.2 per cent would not express an opinion.

An analysis of the findings showed that more women than men supported the exchange deal to bring the two husbands back to their families in the ratio of 78.2 per cent to 71.1 per cent.
