

... at the time employed in the cotton mills. Rev. Fr. Burkle performed the ceremony. Together they lived in L'Anse, true and respected citizens. To this union were born twelve children, six girls and six boys, seven of whom are living.

Mr. Gamache served in several capacities in the town and county governments, among which were: Member of the Board of Education, County Surveyor, member of the Village Council, and the Village and Township Board of Review. The latter position he held at the time of his death.

As a timber estimator and cruiser, Mr. Gamache was an authority for Upper Michigan and Wisconsin. He was employed by all the leading land-owners, among them being the McCormicks of Chicago, the S. L. Smith Corporation, National Pole Company and the L'Anse Lumber Company, besides a number of smaller timber speculators and holders.
