West had visions of a huge plus score when he doubled South's stab at four spades. Unfortunately for West, his strong spades proved not enough and West's dreams became a nightmare.

It was difficult for West to double in soft tones when he heard South's vulnerable overcall of four spades. With all those high spades, East would not need too much for South to suffer some severe punishment.

Well, whatever it was that East needed, East did not have and West was in for some bad news. The game was cold against any defense.

Declarer won the first heart and cashed his ace of spades. The horrible spade break was confirmed, but dummy's power was enough to compensate.

A diamond was led to dummy's king and a diamond came back to the ace. The marked diamond finesse was taken and the rest of the hand was easy. West was due three spade tricks, but declarer took the other 10 and the doubled game came home.

An unlucky double by West? Perhaps. But it could have been even worse. Had declarer played for the actual distribution, he could have scored an overtrick to rub more salt into West's wounds.

To make five, declarer wins the heart ace, cashes four diamonds via a proven finesse and then plays three rounds of clubs, ruffing the third round. This gives declarer eight tricks and trumps

A diamond was led to dummy's king and a diamond came back to the ace. The marked diamond finesse was taken and the rest of the hand was easy. West was due three spade tricks, but declarer took the other 10 and the doubled game came home.

An unlucky double by West? Perhaps. But it could have been even worse. Had declarer played for the actual distribution, he could have scored an overtrick to rub more salt into West's wounds.

To make five, declarer wins the heart ace, cashes four diamonds via a proven finesse and then plays three rounds of clubs, ruffing the third round. This gives declarer eight tricks and trumps
