

Orlando Crash Rains Nightmare Of Flames And Debris Over Six-Block Area

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Base south of her on a routine training mission. Air Force said no bombs were aboard, etc.

The pilot, Capt. Wendell W. Campbell, 30, of Washington, D.C., attempted to guide the crippled B52 back to McCoy and had it under control until the final approach.

"I conclude they thought they had almost made it to the runway," said Lt. Gen. Dougherty. "I assume when the crew saw they couldn't make it, they stuck it down toward the lake. They could have bailed out, but they didn't," he said.

The \$8 million craft plowed into the Silver Beach subdivision six miles south of Orlando, about 50 yards from the closest house and near the shore of a McCoy base recreation lake.

All seven crewmen were killed in the fiery crash. Eight civilians, including seven children who were playing outside their homes, were injured. One of the children was listed in very critical condition with multiple burns.

Lt. Gen. Russel E. Dougherty, commander of the Second Air Force, said the eight-engine, 225-ton bomber reported a fire on board shortly after it took off from McCoy Air Force

The impact carved a 150-foot crater in the ground and scattered burning debris over a six-block area.

In addition to Campbell, the victims were identified as Barry E. Applebee, 26, copilot of Dormansville, N. Y.; Maj. James J. Hammons, 37, bombardier from Shawnee, Ala.; 1st Lt. Robert Heatherly 26, navigator from Mount Vernon, N. Y.; Maj. William E. Kesler, 41, electronic warfare officer of Fukuay-Varina, N. C.; M. Sgt. Allen H. Murray, 53, gunner of Philadelphia, Pa.; and Lt. Col. George M. Gamache, 42, navigator instructor of Somerset, Mass.

Appeal Expected

Boyle Convicted Of Fund Misuse

WASHINGTON (AP) — United Mine Workers president W. A. "Tony" Boyle has been convicted of illegally using union funds in the first federal prosecution of a labor leader for making unlawful campaign contributions.

A U.S. District Court jury returned guilty verdicts against Boyle Friday on each of 13 counts in an indictment that charged him with heading a conspiracy to spread \$49,250 in union funds among Democrats and Republicans in the last half of the 1960's.

Two other officials of the union, secretary-treasurer John Owens, 81, and chief lobbyist James Kmetz, 47, were found innocent.

An appeal was expected for Boyle, whose conviction could ban him from union office, send him to prison for a total of 32 years and cost him \$120,000 in fines.

Boyle was released on a personal recognizance bond pending sentencing for which no date has been set.

The 67-year-old union chief only shook his head in tight-lipped silence when asked for his reaction to the outcome.

The two-week criminal trial was only one of the court attacks against Boyle's leadership of the nearly 200,000-member union. Still to come is a decision on a Labor Department suit which seeks to overturn his 1969 re-election as union president over an insurgent candidate, the late Joseph A. "Jock" Yablonski.

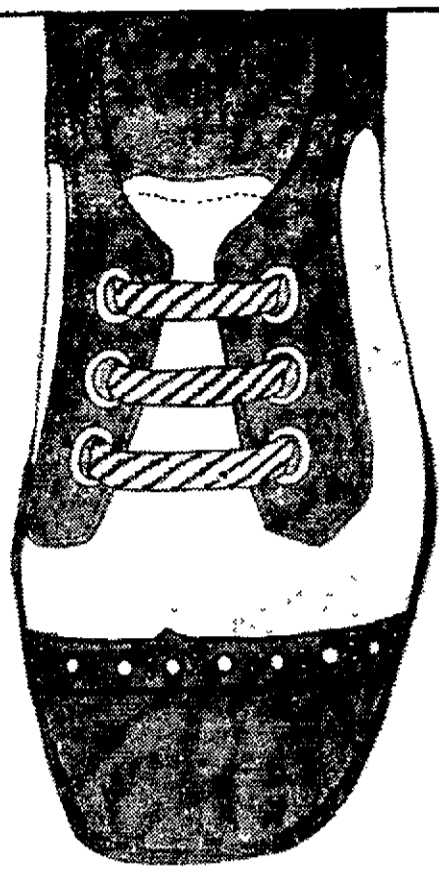

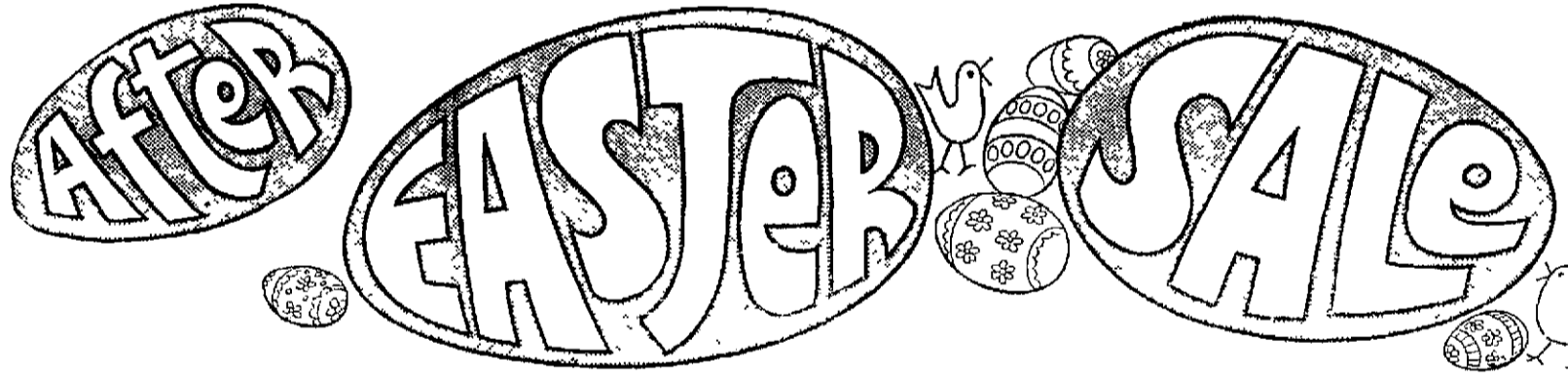

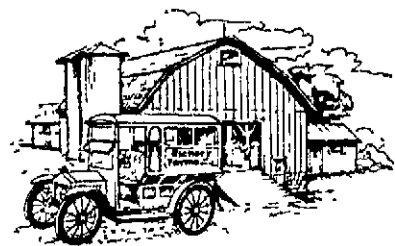
