## Response Grows for ZOA Drive

Huge quantities of important equipment are being shipped to Israel by ZOA districts in Michigan, Max Gross, technical director of the Israel Equipment Project, reports.

Bnai Brith here, in cooperation with the ZOA, has formed a special committee to spur the drive and has rented a warehouse to store contributions.

ZOA officials said they are constantly receiving calls offering donations.

Sponsors expect to be able to send a truck convoy to New York shortly carrying the equipment.

Over \$8,300 worth of equipment has been received by the Zionist Organization of Kalamazoo, including an armored pay truck, a tractor with air compressor and winch, metal workshop machines, medical instruments and 20 cases of military knapsacks.

The response in Flint, Pontiac, Lansing, Bay City and Grand Rapids is equally as enthusiastic.
