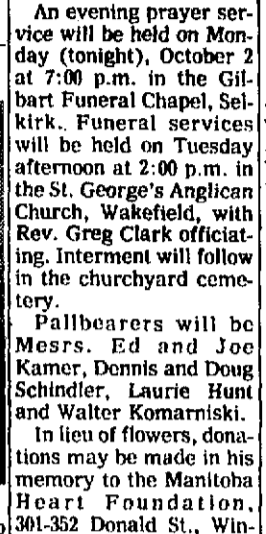
MARY HUPALO (nee JABLONSKI)

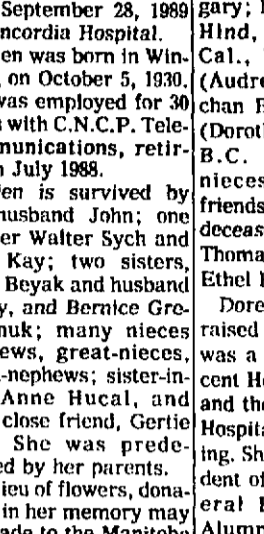
DOREEN FLORENCE MILNE (nee HIND)
