

Gen. Bradley Seriously Ill After Stroke

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Omar N. Bradley, the nation's only remaining five star general, who took his greatest pride as the epitome of the slogging American foot soldier, lay gravely ill today following a stroke.

Bradley, 82, was being treated in the intensive care unit of UCLA Medical Center. His physician termed his condition "very serious."

The soft-spoken but tough Missourian was admitted to the hospital at 1:20 a.m. Monday but news of the stroke was not made known until Wednesday.

UCLA doctors and the Army said he suffered the stroke in the right portion of his brain. A brief statement said he was not paralyzed. However, the guarded reports left little room for optimism about his recovery.

Bradley, who moved to Los Angeles about 10 years ago, underwent emergency surgery for blood clots on his lungs in 1973 but made what his doctors said then was an "exceptional recovery from a critical illness." His physician said there was no connection between the surgery and his present illness.

In the past year Bradley had attended a number of banquets and was seen frequently at the local race tracks betting at the \$50 window. Last year he headed the American delegation to the 30th anniversary of the Allied landings at Normandy on D-Day when he commanded U.S. forces.
