Municipal Officers Deny Permit For Filling Station

The Biddeford municipal officers, in session at the office of Mayor Louis B. Lausier Monday evening unanimously voted to deny the application of Armando Valliere, seeking permission to install three tanks of 1,000 gallons capacity for the storage and sale of gasoline and to operate a filling station at 310 Elm street. The location was to be 50 feet from the nearest building, which is the Frederick F. Beauregard residence on Elm street.

At the opening of the meeting a petition requesting that the permit sought by Mr. Valliere be denied, addressed to the municipal officers bearing the following signatures: Frederick Beauregard, Louis Lamothe, Gerard Campobasso, Mrs. Almeda Campobasso, Mrs. Paul Lamothe, Frank Dutil, John Bonser, Miss Emily Smith, Harry Calderwood, Patrick O'Connell and Mrs. Annie Delorge, residents of the neighborhood where the new filling station was to be erected was read.

Those appearing at the hearing and making personal requests for the denial of Mr. Valliere's application were Mr. Calderwood, Mr. Bonser, Louis Lamothe and Mr. Harry Randall, who expressed their reasons why they were opposed to the erection of such a place of business as contemplated by Mr. Valliere.

The petitioner appeared in his own behalf before the board in explaining his plans for the installation of the the storage tank permit and the type of filling station he planned to erect given the proper permits sought.
