Ray L. Bowen, of Ann Arbor, was elected superintendent of the L'Anse Township Schools for the coming year at a meeting of the Board of Education Monday night. Mr. Bowen visited in L'Anse recently, studied the system and community and, satisfied with his inquiries, filed his application for the position with Charles Jacobsen, secretary of the board. He succeeds H. S. Denison, who has held the position the past who has held the position the past eight years. It was during Mr. Den-ison's regime that the new Junior-Senior High School was erected.

He began his career as a teacher in 1902 in rural and village schools and by intensive study has become one of the outstanding educators of the state with a record as follows:

Teaching rural and village schools, 1902-1909; Supervisor of attendance, Kalamazoo, 1909-1912; Student Cen-tral State Teachers' College and Unitral State Teachers' College and University of Chicago, 1912-1913; Superintendent of Schools, Geneseo, Ill., 1913-18; Student, University of Chicago, 1916-17; Superintendent of Schools, Mitchell, S. D., 1917-18; Farming, Bellevue, Mich., 1918-20; Teacher, Battle Creek, 1920-24; Superintendent of School, St. Louis, Mich., 1924-32; Student at University of Michigan, 1932-34.
