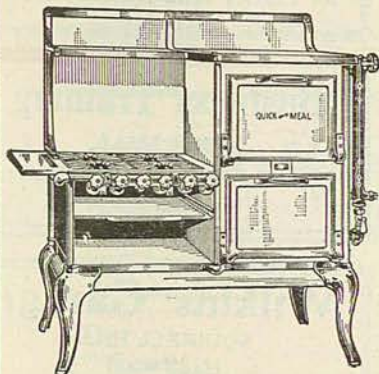
### Gould—Hepps
