Former Pittsburgher Celia Moss Hailperin, credited with beginning the nation's first home-care social work program while working at Montefiore Hospital is being mourned here following her death at age 88 in Honolulu.

She was director of Montefiore's Social Service Department from 1945-1970. She was awarded the Outstanding Social Worker of the Year in 1970 from the National Association of Social Workers.

After her retirement from Montefiore, she was director of continuing education at Pitt's School of Social Work. Additionally, she was project director of research activities for US Children's Bureau for Chronically III Children, the National Institutes of Health Heart Institute and the Pa. Health Department.

After moving to Honolulu, she helped found the Kokua Council for Senior Citizens and Hawaii Senior Net, and was a board member of the VISTA program and advisor to the Honolulu Geronotology Program.

She was the widow of the late Rabbi Herman Hailperin of Tree of Life Synagogue.

She is survived by a son Richard of Los Angeles, three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Within a year or two, they hope that tests based or the discovery will allow doctors to measure very small quantities of leukemic cells remaining in treated patients who would other wise be thought to be disease-free. If such residual disease is discovered, further treatment can be given t produce a true cure.

"We also hope," says Dr. Canaani, "that drugs deve loped against the produc of the defective gene wi be eventually used in treatment."
