Hebrew School attendance is keeping up in spite of vacation, and several new pupils have enrolled.

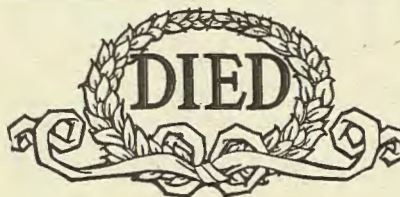
