

## Archie Pecor, 52, Kills Himself

WASHINGTON — Archie Pecor, 52, shot himself in the head with a .22 caliber rifle about 9 p.m. yesterday.

His family rushed upstairs and found the body in the bedroom.

Dr. Charles Perry pronounced him dead and the body was removed to the Whitcomb Funeral Home in East Barre.

Dr. Thomas P. Dunleavy, regional medical examiner, was called to the scene and ruled death as a suicide. Pecor had been in failing health several years.

He was born Dec. 5, 1909, in Middlesex, son of Lewis and Emma (Lovely) Pecor. He married Joyce Harvey in Barre in 1947 and they had made their home in Kansas for seven years, coming to Barre Town in 1954. They have lived in surrounding towns until the present.

Besides his wife, he is survived by four sons, Archie, East Calais, Bernie, Kansas City, Mo., Robert, Barre, and Wayne, at home; four daughters, Sandra, Sheila, Rosemary and Nancy, all living at home; one stepdaughter, Mrs. Eleanor McLaughlin, Barre; three brothers, Oliver, Middlesex, Kenneth, Barre, and Ernest, Bethel; two sisters, Mrs. Frank (Rena) DeForge, Graniteville; and Mrs. Olive Kirby, Montpelier.

He had worked as a stonecutter at Rock of Ages Co.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 at the Whitcomb Funeral Home, 102 Washington St., where friends may call from 7 to 9 Monday and Tuesday evenings.

Burial will be in Washington Cemetery.
