DEATH ELSEWHERE

Madeleine L'Engle, 88, whose novel "A Wrinkle in Time" has captivated generations of schoolchildren and adults since the 1960s, died Thursday in Litchfield, Conn., her publicist said Friday.

The Newbery Medal winner wrote more than 60 books, including fantasies, poetry and memoirs, often highlighting spiritual themes and her Christian faith.

For many years, she was the writer in residence and librarian at the Episcopal Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine in New York City.

Although L'Engle was often labeled a children's author, she disliked that classification. In a 1993 Associated Press interview, she said she did not write down to children.

"In my dreams, I never have an

age," she said. "I never write for any age group in mind. . . . When you underestimate your audience, you're cutting yourself off from your best work."

"A Wrinkle in Time," which L'Engle said was rejected repeatedly before it found a publisher in 1962, won the American Library Association's 1963 Newbery Medal for best American children's book. Her "A Ring of Endless

Light" was a Newbery Honor Book, or medal runner-up, in 1981.

"Wrinkle" tells the story of adolescent Meg Murry, her genius little brother Charles Wallace, and their battle against evil as they search across the universe for their missing father, a scientist.

In 2004, President Bush awarded her a National Humanities Medal.

Evelyn Lincoln Fogarty
November 6, 1912 - August 31, 2007

Evelyn Lincoln Fogarty passed away on August 31, 2007 at the Mt. St. Francis Nursing Center. Born in Chicago, Illinois to Charles and Catherine Lincoln, she attended Our Lady of Mercy Grammar School, The Immaculate High School, and Mundelein College. She loved golf and became a champion tennis player. She also mastered the computer at age 85.


The first in her family to graduate from college, she earned a degree in Journalism. After graduation, she was hired by a local newspaper to cover the police beat. She was married on June 25, 1936, to the late Thomas Patrick Fogarty, a graduate of Loyola University. Honored as "Mother of the Year" by her college, she raised 4 children while assisting her husband with his square dancing enterprise. She also struggled as a single mother while her husband served in the Navy during World War II. As an empty nester, she became interested in tracing her family's history. Her only clue to her ancestors was her maiden name, *Lincoln*. Immersing herself in the study of genealogy, she traced her family back to President Abraham Lincoln, Pilgrims John Alden and Priscilla Mullens, and then to England and signers of the Magna Carta. Professional memberships included the National Society Magna Carta Dames, National Society of New England Women, Society of Mayflower Descendants, National Society Women Descendants of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, and Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, 1861-1865. A thirty year member of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, she was an officer in their branch of the Council of Catholic Women.

A loving, kind, and gentle caregiver, her compassionate spirit touched the lives of all she encountered. She was passionate about her family, and followed each member's life journey with loving intensity.

Her adored younger sister, LaVerne, passed away at the age of 20, the victim of a heart problem. She is survived by sons Joseph Charles (Teri) and Michael John, and daughters Mary Ann (Dr. Richard J. Martwick, IV) and Kathleen Bride (Dr. George O. Paddock). Surviving grandchildren include Jeanne Marie Fogarty, Patricia Ann Gise, Christine Marie (Coleman) Lannum, Susan Ann (Dr. Eric) Bernstein, Peter Christopher (Lynn) Fogarty, Richard J. Born shortly before Hitler's invasion of Hungary during WW II, he lived first under German occupation and then Soviet occupation until, at the age of 17, he left his family and fled the country of his birth. On December 31, 1956, he arrived in America and started his life of freedom.

He was mistakenly drafted into the Army in 1959, but he agreed to serve anyway. He was active duty for two years, most of them spent in Germany, and he was in the reserves for two more years.

After becoming a United States citizen in 1962, he married Cathy Collins of Philadelphia. They made their home in Plainsboro, NJ and rejoiced in the birth of their two children. Paul was able to bring his parents to the United States for a visit in 1968, sharing with them the joys of his life in his new country.

In 1977 Paul moved his family to Colorado Springs, where he worked at the Western Museum of Mining and Industry as an artisan until the late 1980's and then he went to work at the United States Air Force Academy. He took pride in his job and received numerous awards for his service to the Academy.
