Polish Premier Pledges Jews Equal Rights in Post-War Poland

Washington — Gen. Wladislaw Sikorski, Premier of the Polish Government-in-exile, predicted after a conference with President Roosevelt that the end of the war would see the rise of a free, independent and democratic Poland with "equal rights and responsibilities for all races and minorities."

At a press conference at the Polish embassy, the Polish leader told reporters: "I am a loyal and truthful man and I declare that the Jews will have equal rights and equal obligations with all other Polish citizens."

Discussing the democratic program for post-war Europe, Gen. Sikorski declared that there would be a federation of nations in central eastern Europe, in which both Poland and Yugoslavia were destined to play important roles.

After leaving the White House, the exiled Polish Premier told assembled newspapermen: "I am extremely heartened by my conversation with the President and strengthened in my firm belief that a free and independent Poland will rise again after the war, fully democratic and fully conscious of its mission in the world."


