PITTSFIELD — Gloria G. Hughes passed away Friday, March 16, 2012, at Berkshire Medical Center, in the loving presence of her family.

Gloria was born Gloria Mary Green in Troy, NY on April 5, 1936, the eldest child of the late Clinton Boice Green and Charlotte D. Sinsabaugh Green. She grew up in the Lansingburgh area of Troy, NY, where she was baptized and confirmed at Trinity Episcopal Church. After graduating from Lansingburgh High School in 1954, Gloria worked as a bookkeeper at Cluett, Peabody & Co. until November 1963, when she married Edward Hughes and moved to Pittsfield.

Gloria worked as an administrative secretary for the City of Pittsfield at City Hall, then for the Massachusetts Dept. of Public Safety, from 1980 until her retirement in 2001. She was a committed, active member of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, where she served as choir mother, Sunday school teacher, Altar Guild member, and as a lay leader for communion. She was well known for her contributions to church fundraising and mission projects, especially for her gifts of creativity in confections, cake decorating, and construction of intricate gingerbread villages. She also felt privileged to serve at St. Stephen's Table. Gloria was a member of PEO, Chapter 7, wherein she enjoyed great friendship and love and passionately supported the education of women around the world.

In addition to her involvement with the church and PEO, Gloria was active in the local community, volunteering as a librarian at Egremont School when her children were young, and supporting local sports through her children and grandchildren, especially ice hockey, baseball, figure skating and ballet. She loved reading and going to theatre and concert events.

Gloria is survived and dearly missed by her husband, Edward Hughes, three children, Edward S., Nancy, and Susan Hughes, two grandchildren who brought her the greatest joy, Edward D. and Rebecca Hughes, two brothers, Ronald and Dennis Green, and their families.

Mrs. Doherty was the daughter of Elizabeth (Doyle) and John "Shano" Collins, the last Boston-born Boston Red Sox manager for two seasons from 1930-1931 and a player for the Chicago White Sox and Boston Red Sox from 1910 to 1925. She was the mother of Ellen Steeby and her husband James of Jackson, Miss., and William Doherty and his wife Marjorie of North Andover; grandmother of Elizabeth Steeby of New Orleans, La.

She was the wife of the late William F. Doherty of Arlington and had four siblings: Virginia, Eleanor, Robert and William.

Born in Pittsfield and raised in Newton before living in Arlington for over 50 years, Mrs. Doherty worked at the former James Lawrence & Co. on Batterymarch St. in Boston and subsequently as a medical secretary.

She was a fan of baseball, Northeastern University hockey, the television show Wheel of Fortune, and most of all crossword puzzles, and art she inherited from her Charlestown-raised father, who, she often pointed out, educated himself through that genre as a train-riding professional baseball teammate of Shoeless Joe Jackson, Buck Weaver, and others.

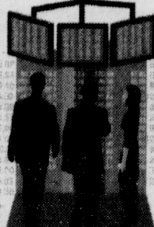
Two brothers and two sisters are deceased.

Joseph Roy Boivin

1924-2012

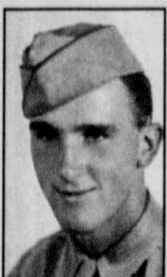
PITTSFIELD — Joseph Roy Boivin died peacefully on March 15, 2012 in Chandler, Ariz., at the age of 87.

He was born July 28, 1924 in Pittsfield, the son of Rose Mary Lassar and Isadore Joseph Boivin. Known to everyone as "Joe", he attended area schools, graduating from Pittsfield High School in 1942.

On his eighteenth birthday, Joe enlisted in the Army and fought bravely in World War II, serving as Sergeant in Battery C 101st Field Artillery, positioned in the European theater. For his distinguished service, Joe was awarded a Bronze Star, a Croix de Guerre, and a Purple Heart.

After the war, Joe returned to Pittsfield and married Virginia H. Kozack. He became a master carpenter, working for many large construction companies in the Berkshires including Barbalanuga; Carroll, Verge & Whipple; Emerson; Arace; and Allegrone Construction. Mr. Boivin built over 200 houses, in addition to schools, banks, churches, and other public buildings, often serving as job foreman or superintendent. He had a reputation as a tireless worker and a demanding boss with very high standards.

Joe was a past member of the VFW and Elks Club in Pittsfield. His hobbies included hunting and fishing, but working with wood was Joe's passion. He continued to work daily in his workshop until the end of his



life, creating projects to give as gifts to family and friends. He inspired everyone with his strong work ethic and determination to always strive for perfection in his work.

Mr. Boivin leaves his loving wife, Katharine Settle, whom he married in 2004. They resided in Columbia City, Oregon and Casa Grande, Ariz., and he considered his fifteen years with Kathe to be the happiest years of his life, as they were able to travel extensively and enjoy retirement.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Boivin leaves three adult children from his first marriage: Virginia B. Peniuk and her husband, Sylvester, of Lanesboro; Joan B. Hunter and her husband, James, of Williamstown; and Joseph D. Boivin of Manchester, Conn. He also leaves his dearly loved grandchildren: Elizabeth Calderwood, Ryan Boivin, Sarah Hunter, Courtney Boivin; Maggie Hunter, Myles Boivin and Christopher Boivin; his great-grandchildren, Cody Barber, Dean Parise and Gianna Parise; and numerous nieces and nephews. pitching the show to the 600 stations that carry Limbaugh, as well as other outlets, has branded it as a less feisty alternative.

Limbaugh, with an estimated 20 million listeners, is midway through an eight-year contract with Premiere Networks, a subsidiary of Clear Channel Communications, worth about \$50 million a year.

"I'm not a person who would call anyone by names that would cause my late mother to come out of her grave and slap me to the floor," Huckabee told the Journal.

Barry predicted as many as 30 other stations would drop Limbaugh in favor of Huckabee once their existing 90-day renewable contracts with Premiere Networks expire. He acknowledged that WBEC "broke" its contract with Limbaugh's syndicate by canceling the program on March 5.

"We will honor any penalties in accordance with the contract," Barry said.

"I don't think Rush will survive unscathed," Barry added. "No one stays No. 1 forever, and his gaffe has created opportunities for people" to compete more effectively against him.
